# Pastor's Message

Recent Sundays, we have been sharing in the joy of the children who have received their First Communion and that of their families. I commend the parents who have made an effort to prepare their children for this special day of faith in their journey with Jesus and His Church.

"Hats off" to our parish Council of the Knights of Columbus who sponsored and organized a Dinner/Dance last Saturday. In addition to great food, there was a wonderful spirit of joy in our parish hall. A number of parishioners mentioned that this was the first social gathering of parishioners in nearly four years – since the beginning of the infamous pandemic. As the Knights were the cooks and bottle washers, they were able to keep the price at a modest 20 dollars per person. They raised \$2,000 for the West Carleton Food Bank. This event captures well the contribution of an active Knights' Council in a parish. There was fraternity and unity among themselves as they put on the event. There was charity in contributing to an important outreach in our community. The event was a community builder for our parish community. Based on my experience, I can say that an active Council of the Knights of Columbus makes a world of difference in a parish. Although little is said about the financial products available to Knights, for the well-being of their families, it is important to know that, in addition to life insurance, the Knights provide RRSPs, TFSAs and long-term care insurance. Insurance revenues are used to support the Catholic Church; for example, through loans to dioceses and sponsoring scholarships and other good works. Currently, the Knights are covering the costs of a major restoration of Bernini's baldacchino which is over the main altar in St. Peter's in Vatican City. If you are interested in joining the Knights, please speak to any Knight. Blair Murphy is the Grand Knight of our Council.

An active Catholic Women's League is also a great asset for a parish. In attending the CWL meeting last Sunday, I was encouraged by the enthusiasm and commitment of the members who were present. The CWL will be sponsoring a "Baby Shower" for St. Mary's Home on the first Sunday of June (they will provide further information in the coming weeks). They are also sponsoring the recital of the Rosary in May before the Sunday Masses. The members are planning a potluck, open to women of the parish who would like to know more about the CWL. On April 26th, we celebrated Mass to honour Our Lady of Good Counsel who is the heavenly patron of the CWL.

Last Thursday, we observed the Feast Day of St. Mark. He is one of the four Evangelists (Gospel writers) but, like St. Luke, he is not one of the Twelve Apostles who include the two other Gospel writers – St. Matthew and St. John. In the tradition, it is thought that St. Mark provided one of the houses for the "house churches" in Jerusalem where the first Christians gathered for Eucharist. Based on texts from the New Testament, we know that St. Mark accompanied both St. Paul and St. Peter in their apostolic mission. He, therefore, would have been an auricular witness of their preaching. Next Wednesday, we begin the month of May, which is the traditional month of Mary in our Catholic Faith and practice. The Rosary has been one of our principal prayers to honour the Blessed Virgin and to meditate on the mysteries of the life of Our Lord and his mother's participation in them. An infograph is being sent with the Bulletin, which explains how to pray this Marian prayer, and the Mysteries used when praying. The Rosary is easily adaptable for individual prayer and for prayer in groups, such as families.

Want to Buy a bike? The floor is open from 8:30 to 11:00 am on Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at the Jack Charron Arena (10 McKitrick Dr, Kanata). The lineup starts early. Cash or cheque with ID only. Bike prices range from \$10 to \$300, typically 33% of the retail store price.

Want to Sell a bike? Bike drop-off is from 6:00 to 8:00 pm on Friday, April 26<sup>th</sup> or 7 to 8:30 am on Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at the Jack Charron Arena. \$1 fee per item for putting it in the sale. Sellers set a fixed price. If an item sells, 1st Kanata keeps a 20% commission, sellers collect their 80% of the price (and any unsold items) between 11:30 am – 12 pm on Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup>. Unsold items not collected are treated as donations.
