Pastor's Message

We have begun the month of May, the traditional "Month of Mary" of our Catholic faith and practice. With last Sunday's bulletin, we sent an information sheet which provided a guide on how to pray the Rosary with the four series of Mysteries. In his Apostolic Exhortation *Marialis Cultus*, for the Right Ordering and Development of Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Pope St. Paul VI encouraged the family recital of the Rosary: "... after the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours, the high point which family prayer can reach, the Rosary should be considered as one of the best and most efficacious prayers in common that the Christian family is invited to recite. We like to think, and sincerely hope, that when the family gathering becomes a time of prayer, the Rosary is a frequent and favored manner of praying."

On Monday, May 6th, we celebrate another of our Canadian saints – St. François de Laval (d. 1708), the first bishop of Quebec who laid the foundation of the Church in Quebec, Canada and for much of North America. Among his works was the founding of the Séminaire de Québec which provided for the formation of the clergy and the education of boys and men of the early French colony. He was beatified by Pope St. John Paul II in 1980 and Pope Francis declared him, and his "Co-Founder" St. Marie de l'Incarnation, saints in 2014. In Quebec, the City of Laval and Laval University in Quebec City honour his memory.

On May 12, which this year falls on Ascension Sunday, Catholics are invited to observe World Communications Day. We reflect on the influence of the media of social communication, which include new forms beyond the traditional ones of newspapers, radio and television. The media can promote values which lead to a more fully human society. From the faith perspective, the media is being used to promote the Gospel. Our Catholic values enable us to judge those media presentations which promote virtues and spiritual growth. (cf. Ordo, p. 124)

One of the sacraments made available in our parish is the Anointing of the Sick. Parishioners may receive the sacrament when they are experiencing serious illness, are preparing for surgery, or are experiencing a decline in health due to infirmity or age. Reception of the sacrament is strongly recommended when a believer enters the final stages of life, particularly when someone enters palliative care. Anointing is most effective when the person being anointed is able to consciously participate in the celebration of the sacrament. The presence of family and friends is often a consolation. If you wish to receive the Anointing of the Sick, please feel free to contact me to arrange a time – by phone 613 592-1961 ext 3.
