Pastor's Message

At last Sunday's **Annual General Meeting of Parishioners**, about 40 parishioners attended to receive reports from the Pastoral Council (PPC) and the Finance Council (PFC). The meeting took place after the Sunday 11 am Mass. After the adoption of the final version of the revised Constitution of the Pastoral Council, we proceeded to the nomination and election of two new members of the PPC. **Mich Charbonneau** and **Roman Marushko** will join the PPC as new members. Let us pray that the Lord will bless them in their new service to our faith community. There are several members of the PPC who are finishing their term. On behalf of parishioners, I thank them for their dedication and generous participation in our parish life. I want to note the leadership that has been offered by **Anne Desjardins** (Chair) and **Dan Fischer** (Vice-Chair). They facilitated the PPC portion of the meeting. Both will continue as members of the PPC. The newly constituted Council will elect a Chair and Vice-Chair at our first meeting in September. **Christian Kratchanov**, as Chair of the Finance Council, presented the financial report for the year ending December 31, 2025. While a surplus was noted for the year, including the payment of some of the mortgage principal, the parish is still in a challenging position with respect to meeting our operating expenses and establishing a clear plan for the payment of the mortgage. As our buildings and equipment are aging with increasing costs for repair and replacement, the need to establish a plan for capital expenditures and reserves is a priority in the coming year. Membership of the Finance Council is also being renewed. On behalf of parishioners, I thanked members of the Finance Council finishing their term. They served during a challenging time of change and transition for our parish. A period of Questions and Answers ended the meeting. In the coming weeks, meeting notes will be sent to parishioners. Our thanks go to the CWL who prepared lunch again this year.

Recently, the Archbishop announced a number of clergy appointments. I am pleased to report that **Deacon Dave Lauzon** has received a new three-year appointment to our parish. God bless you, Deacon Dave, in your continuing ministry to us!

This Sunday, we have a special collection for the **Indigenous Reconciliation Fund** which was established to accept donations from 73 Catholic Dioceses across the country, and to advance healing and reconciliation initiatives, fulfilling the \$30 million financial commitment made by Canada's Bishops in September 2021. Members of our Ottawa-Cornwall diocese have responded generously in previous years. The hope is that we will complete our commitment with this year's collection. The fund seeks to support projects that are determined locally, in collaboration with First Nations, Métis and Inuit partners.

We wish **"Happy Father's Day"** to all fathers, especially those of our parish – those still with us and those who have gone to meet our Heavenly Father. May God grace our fathers in their special vocation in family life!
